\* Saving Whiskers and Tails realized a need to focus much of our attention on "kill" shelters in our area. Most shelters in rural Oklahoma are understaffed and do not have the resources to move animals to safety within their allotted time. SWAT, on a weekly basis takes pictures, writes pet bios, shares to Facebook and multiple adoption sites. We field phone calls and emails, schedule meet and greets for the local shelter. Since we began working with the Rockin' G Animal Shelter in Pryor, OK, they went from euthanizing an average of 8 dogs a month to NO dogs being euthanized because of space in the last 4 years.

\*\*Live Release, as dictated by the Asilomar Accords, is calculated by dividing Total Live Release by the sum of Total Live Release and Total Euthanasia. These numbers do not include the Rockin' G Animal Shelter and other "kill" shelters that we work with.
